Science advisers in Estonia

The system of **Estonian science advisers** created in the frameworks of programme **RITA** – National programme for Addressing Socio-Economic Challenges through R&D.

Co-financed by ERDF.

Work informally coordinated by ETAg:

e-mailing list of advisers, meetings, trainings, study tours, sharing of experiece, preparing common projects;

Formally coordinated by Ministry of Education and Science:

input to science policy under Ministry of Education and Science; advising R&D and Innovaton Council at Government Office.





Science advisers in Estonia

Science advisers must have a doctoral degree or at least four years of research experience.

Their mandate/mission is to advise ministries on R&D issues, planning national and international R&D cooperation, developing plans of R&D needs, implement them and representing Estonia in International R&D actions.

The scientific advisors have been integrated into several advisory bodies like Horizon 2020 programme committees, science policy committee etc.



Science advisers network is useful and effective in sense of improving cooperation and information sharing among different ministries.

- 1. Sharing of experience and information,
- 2. Mutual learning,
- 3. Interministerial cooperation, common goals, common projects. Up to 7 ministries (among others Government Office) working with one project.
