## **The Technical Support Instrument (TSI)**


• Provides tailor-made technical expertise to EU Member States

- Covers a wide range of reform areas, in any reform phase
- National and regional level (including outermost regions)
- € 864 million of budget for the period 2021-2027

# Technical Support for the implementation of the Recovery and Resilience Plans

### **TSI** support in the context of the RRF

- Support can be provided for the "preparation, amendment and revision of recovery and resilience plans [...] and the implementation thereof undertaken by Member States" – Art. 9(d) of TSI Regulation
- 2 types of support:
  - 1. General support, horizontally applicable, for a smooth implementation of the RRPs
  - 2. Thematic support, targeting specific reforms and investments in the RRPs

# More than 300 TSI projects linked to the preparation or implementation of the RRPs

57% of TSI 2022 selected requests linked to the implementation of the RRPs



### Support for the RRP implementation under TSI 2023

**General & thematic support** available to Member States under TSI 2023

- While the TSI may provide input to help achieve RRP measures, Member States <u>remain fully responsible</u> for RRP implementation
- Need for careful alignment between the timelines of RRP reforms and investments & the TSI project deliverables
  - for TSI 2023, reforms/investments preferably with a related DDL in Q1 2024 or later







# Flagship technical support projects

### What is a flagship technical support project?

- Project proactively proposed by DG REFORM that:
  - Largely needed across Member States
  - Meets a top EU / Commission priority
  - Is designed in a way that can easily be fitted to various national contexts
- Its uptake is voluntary
- TSI 2022 almost 50% of selected projects
- TSI 2023 **12 projects** covering 6 thematic pillars

### Multi-country (multi-regional) projects

A multi-country or multi-regional project is a technical support project that is relevant or common to more than one Member State as it belongs to the same policy area and addresses the same priorities for technical support

The tailored approach and the speed of delivery of the project is ensured



#### Supporting reforms in FRANCE Technical Support Instrument 2022 - Country Factsheet

The Technical Support Instrument (TSI) is the EU programme that provides tailor-made technical expertise to EU Member States to design and to implement reforms at the national level, with an emphasis on the green and digital transitions. The TSI also supports the preparation and implementation of <u>Recovery and Resilience Plans</u>. TSI 2022 main novellies are the multicountry projects, geared at addressing common issues among Member States thereby underlying the EU added-value of the instrument, and the <u>"Flagabilp" projects</u> (inter-), supporting reforms which are largely needed across Member States and are in line with the EU priorities.

Initiated in 2021, the TSI is the successor of the Structural Reform Support Programme (SRSP) Since 2017, both programmes have helped design, develop and implement over <u>1400 reform</u> projects ("univer") in 27 Member States.

#### 10 NEW PROJECTS SELECTED UNDER TSI 2022

With the second round of the TSI, the Commission will support France with 10 projects in the areas of digitalisation of justice, public administration (simplification of administrative procedures), education (focusing on special needs education and life-long learning for teachers), financial literacy, promoting equality in policy and budgeting process. 3 of those projects are multicountry projects.

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#### 12 NEW PROJECTS SELECTED UNDER TSI 2022

With the second round of the TSI, the Commission will support Portugal with 12 projects in the areas of digital public services, gender mainstreaming, sustainable tourism, public finance management, genomic medicine, reform of public administration, taxation of agricultural properties, sustainable maritime and fisheries policies, management and control systems for EU funds. 3 of those projects are multi-country projects.

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#### 12 NEW PROJECTS SELECTED UNDER TSI 2022

With the second round of the TSI, the Commission will support Spain with 12 projects in the areas of digital government; judicial systems; energy policy; sustainable development; competition and consumer policy; financial supervision & fintech; digital health; inclusive education; social protection benefit systems; and digital skills. 3 of those projects are multi-country projects.

This Flagship Technical Support Project is targeted at Member States wishing to streamline and accelerate their permitting processes for renewable energy.

# Flagship Technical Support project risk management framework for the financial sector

This Flagship Technical Support Project aims to support Member States' national competent authorities (NCAs) – financial supervisory authorities and central banks – in overseeing the mitigation of environmental, social and governance (ESG) risks in the financial sector by implementing the related existing and forthcoming EU regulatory framework.

- ✓ Support Member States to strengthen their capacity to monitor and address ESG risk in the financial sector, while also increasing consumers and investors' awareness of the ESG impact of individual financial choices
- ✓ Support Member States to enhance the level of resilience and stability of the financial system on a national and cross-border basis, and to contribute to the green transition in the EU









#### Flagship Technical Support project Support to industrial ecosystems

This Flagship Technical Support Projects aims to support Member States in the design and implementation of reforms to boost competitiveness, sustainability, resilience and employment.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Support MSs strength their administrative capacity to support industrial transformation, by preparing horizontal or sectoral industrial strategies




### Flagship Technical Support project Migrant integration and talent attraction






#### Flagship Technical Support project Digital transformation for regional and local public administrations
