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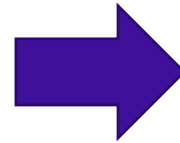

# Building capacity for long-term, horizontal, anticipatory governance

**we need to look further ahead  
and with a wider perspective**



**LT2050 as a vehicle for building  
strategic foresight capacity**

- Shortage of skills and competence in anticipatory, future-oriented governance
- Insufficient use of international best practices
- Lack of systemic analysis of strategic-level policy questions

- Pilot project for application of SF in EIPM
- Inclusive process to expose governance actors and stakeholders to SF
- A systemic survey of all major policy areas and related policymaking ecosystems

# Steps/conditions to embed strategic foresight in national policymaking

1. Political ownership: PM's portfolio
2. Better regulation: accommodating changes to national strategic planning system
3. Institutional change: establishment of the Future committee in the Parliament
4. Partnership: cooperation with academia and other expert communities

# Uptake of strategic foresight by the policy ecosystem

- LT2050 currently under parliamentary review and pending final approval
- Consolidating best practices: Parliament's "White Book" on foresight
- Input to policymaking: e.g., MFA's Indo-Pacific Strategy
- Continuous international and national exchange: e.g., participation in the Spanish Presidency's OSA project
