The interministerial CSO-network

THE BASICS

- Formed in 2020, first meeting March 2020
- > 10 out of 12 ministries are part of the network
- Ministries either represented by a CSO (3), or strategic advisor, head of innovation and strategy, etc.

- Network is informal in nature (no mandate)
- Convenes every 2 months, with one subject brought to the table by one of the CSO's



A short history of the network

TIMELINE

- Formed in 2020
- Creation of a shared
 Kennisagenda (knowledge
 agenda) 'Online Society' in
 2021, as a response to the
 covid-19 crisis

- > 2021-2022: Creation of a shared research budget through the National Science Agenda to tackle questions from the shared knowledge agenda
- Q4 2022: Call for proposals



Current function of the network

INCLUDES:

- Strengthening ties between departements
- Identifying research gaps which concern multiple departments
- Getting input on shared challenges (e.g. infrastructure for research publications)


Providing input for knowledge/research agendas
