The technical support instrument (TSI)

- Provides tailor-made technical expertise to EU Member States to design and implement reforms
- Is demand driven and does not require any co-financing from Member States
- Covers a wide range of reform areas, in any reform phase
- National and regional level (including outermost regions)



TSI in 2022 – general call

225 requests approved in 2022

- 57% contribute to the implementation of the Recovery and Resilience Plans
- 52% contribute to digital transition
- 36% contribute to green transition





TSI in 2022 – dedicated call

 Dedicated call for emerging needs in relation to the Russian invasion of Ukraine (focus on energy dependency and welcoming of third country nationals)



- € 9 million
- 32 requests from 20 Member States

Technical support instrument - 2023 priorities

Strengthen further the support to EU priorities, notably through

- Contribution to the implementation of Recovery and Resilience Plans
- Proposal of a new set of flagship projects on common
 EU reform needs
- Further increase of multi-country (multi-regional)
 projects
